# Preface

## Reason for the Sale

Due to the imminent sale of our property in Redcliffe I am forced to reduce the number of birds that I keep to about 10 pairs. I intend to retain some birds to breed for One Loft Races and Breeders Plates.

I will not be racing for at least 3 years, and due to work commitments. I have not raced this season and only flew the Kings Cup Breeders Plate last year.

So that other pigeon enthusiasts have the opportunity to breed from the best of my birds, instead of them sitting more or less unused, over the next few years I have decided to sell most of them now.

All the foundation birds are being sold. Some of them have produced spectacularly in Australia and Internationally.

The older stock still has a good 5-10 years left in them and the younger birds that I have raced or trained will be able to be bred from for a long time to come. Some of the older birds can be foundations for new lofts or enhance the performance of existing lofts, such is their quality.

## Middle to Long Distance Focus

First, let me say that I don't want plodders. My focus has been on trying to win long races on the day. These days if you don't clock on the day (or during the night), even from 600 to 700 miles, you generally can't win. I have developed birds that will meet this need.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank Alf del Brocco for some of the best birds I have ever owned that have contributed heavily towards these goals.

Those people who race with me, and other people who race my birds, recognize that the lines of birds I have created need very little maintenance to perform well above the average. I neither had the time to work the birds hard in training, or the inclination to medicate them. They largely do what they do on their own.

For those people buying my birds this means that they will get naturally robust birds. **Be patient with these birds because they are better two year olds** than young birds. Treat them well and they will reward you for many years. I flew one hen for 6 years in the QRPF. In her 6<sup>th</sup> year she won 12<sup>th</sup> fed Windorah – then I stocked her.

My focus and interest has been on the races from 350 miles upwards. The shorter races hold no interest for me at all. I do not even bother to electronically band birds until they

get to Rockhampton. Because the race programs are heavily weighted to the shorter races it means that I don't fly many races each season, I often jump birds from 180km to 600km and expect them to be in the front packs. Birds treated in this way have been nominated and won the money.

Through the application of intellect and severe selection I have produced the type of birds that reliably achieve success in the races that I target. It took 10 years to achieve this goal. As a buyer, you can reap the rewards of my efforts immediately, without the wait.

Over the past few years, due to not being able to race myself, I have partnered with Philip Trevethan and David Zhao in Murrumba Syndicate. We race under this name in the North Road Combine from Phil Trevethans loft and in One Loft races and Breeders Plates in Australia and Internationally (in the South African Million Dollar Pigeon Race).

My birds have also been raced or bred from successfully by others, like Danny Warry (our Auctioneer) in QLD, Dennis Russell in Adelaide, Machar and Wojack in the VHA and Vince and Carlos Pedavoli in the Cumberland Fed, NSW, not to mention the many successes in the SAMDPR.

## **Result Highlights**

It's probably best to let the birds that Murrumba Syndicate fly 'do the talking' with some highlighted results in Australian and International competition.

## **Key Lines**

I have developed several lines of birds that perform in the One Loft Races and the Club & Combine races that I am interested in - from 350 miles upwards. They are:

- Jan Aarden based
- Oscar Devriendt
- Van Loon
- Long Distance Janssen, based around Phil Trevethan's Townsville cock
- A smattering of Gaby & Houben

Some of these families are not well known. Some are completely unknown, but they have all been selected to perform in slightly different niches. They are all important to the goal I set out to achieve.

## Genetic Diversity

It is vitally important that every loft has genetic diversity. It gives you the ammunition to compete at most distances and all but the most extreme weather conditions.

For example, the Jan Aardens handle difficult head wind races. The Deverienchts love shoulder winds and higher velocities and the Van Loons like head winds and have a special performance window from 300 to 400 miles. People who specialize on certain lines paint themselves into a performance corner.

## Mitochondrial DNA

In the catalog following, you will note that the common Mitochondrial DNA ancestor is recorded.

### Why is this important?

Mitochondria is a symbiotic 'parasite' that has evolved with warm blooded life. It works symbiotically with the host to generate energy in a process known as the ATP cycle. It is in effect the 'Power Cell' for ourselves and our birds.

Importantly **Mitochondria can ONLY be passed down by females**, in the egg (ovum). **The male can make no contribution** to this. He simply inherits what he gets, and because he does not lay eggs, he can not pass on his Mitochondria.

The **really important implication** is that if you want robust birds, with the right 'power cells' you **must** focus on the Mitochondrial DNA i.e. your hens. Some people know this intuitively, but this is the scientific explanation why you need to choose the right hens!

There are many other genetic factors that contribute to performance but the ability to produce energy efficiently and effectively comes from the mother – and **ONLY** the mother!

I keep a very close track of this. When you are reviewing the birds below, you will note that some ancestors are very, very dominant. Look out for the influence in my birds of "Karelyn", 6226, 24077, 9983, etc.

## Management

All of these families perform well under my management. I am not a heavy trainer and the Vets make very little money from me. I also don't spend a lot of time cleaning and use a powdered droppings floor, sometimes called 'deep litter'.

My birds are all very sensible. The hens are often very affectionate.

Given my 'free and easy' management system, the birds nearly always exceed my expectations.

If this is the type of bird you need or want, then spend the time to have a good look through this catalogue.

Every loft has a Star. 8847 is mine. He is the best bird I have ever had the privilege to own since I started racing pigeons in 1974. He is now 10 years old but he is still robust and never misses filling an egg. He is available for sale with a reserve. He is the only bird in the Auction with a reserve price.

### **QRPF-04-8847 Aarden/Huskens van Riel**

2nd Club, 4th Sect Thargomindah. G.Son of foundation cock 200479 and foundation hen 8569.

#### **8847 is versatile and prepotent!**

- He raced well himself.
- He has been successful breeding with almost any female line, including Houben, Janssen, Jan Aarden, Van Loon & Jos Thone.
- His strike rate of good birds produced is extremely high
- He is robust and healthy and his children inherit this trait
- I have never seen him miss fertilising eggs!
- He has bred Children, Grandchildren and Great Grandchildren to win
- He breeds well when crossed and when bred back closely to his own lines
- Most importantly his children, of both sexes, continue to breed. This has been proved many times over - examples are his sons 766 & 7994 and his daughter 10158 having all produced winners.
- His children have won in all conditions (but prefer harder days) both locally and internationally (e.g. Sun City)
- His children have won at all distances from 200km to 1000+km
- His children descendants have won races for many people, all with differing management methods – a real testament of his versatility.
- For those people interested in eyesign, 8847 has a dominant violet eye.

Some of his and his progeny's notable race performances are:

- Sire of Pininfarina (hen): 1st National Hotspot 5, SCMDPR, Australia, 2008
- Pininfarina was purchased at auction in South Africa by John van den Bos after the Sun City main race. She later bred John's clock bird from a difficult 990km race.
- Sire of Liana (hen): Completed the 2008 Sun City race in a good position. Liana is Pininfarina's nestmate sister.
- Sire of Debbie (hen): 1st National Hotspot 5, SCMDPR, Australia, 2010
- Sire of 10158 (hen): Bred for stock
  - Dam of hen gifted to Danny Warry who was 1st Bowen, NRC, 2013.
  - G.Dam of Graeme Temperly's (Rockhampton club) clock bird from 600 miles in 2010. There were only 3 birds home in race time in this event.
  - Dam of Phil Trevethan's hen twice 2nd bird to his loft and 3rd Gladstone in the North Road Combine

**8847 progeny - a Remarkable Performance in 2013 Adelaide Sires Produce Race**

In the Smash Adelaide Sire Produce in 2013 there were only 14 day birds and less than 60 birds homed in race time from the 334 birds sent. 8847 had 5 Grandchildren in the race and 4 were in the top prizes!! They were placed 11th, 21st, 42nd and 51st. The last of his Grand children homed just out of race time - 5 home from 5 sent! This is a fantastic breeding performance by any measure!

**Other notable performances of 8847's progeny are:**

2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places in the NRC Young Bird Derby in 2013 for Danny Warry and Wayne Buckingham, respectively.

The highlight for me however was Danny Warry's 1st NRC Club, 4th Combine from Bowen (952km) with a young Blue Bar hen from 8847's daughter, 10158!

**The Townsville Cock**

In addition to this Jan Aarden line the Murrumba Syndicate maintains a long distance Janssen line bred around "The Townsville cock", - 2nd QRPF Fed 700 miles for Phil Trevethan.

He is a very inbred bird that is mostly Janssen of the Jan Louis/Sheer Elegance lines with some other introductions. He is a magnificent long caste bird that breeds as well as he raced.

Notably, the Townsville cock is the sire of several major prizes in the Sun City Million Dollar Pigeon race, including 1st National Australia in 2009 (Stephanie), 76th overall in 2010 (William Lang) and 76th overall in 2011 with Lesley. Lesley was bred by John van den Bos in South Africa from Stephanie, our 2009 prize winner.

**The Devriendts**

The Devriendts are an old, but very prepotent family that is suited to faster day races. They were imported by Paul Rose (NSW) from the USA, from Campbell Strange. I have a lot of material on them if people are interested. They will add vigour to any family.

Stephanie's mother is a Devriendt hen. Devriendts have also won 9<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> SAMDPR positions in the main race. These winners come from are the same lines I keep.

The old saying that 'the apple does not fall far from the tree' is clearly evident with all of these successful families.

I introduced a single Houben hen in 2008. I contacted Neil Machar and asked him to mate two birds for me for the purposes of improving our Sun City race chances. The hen he bred was 24077 (Lot 56). She has been a phenominal breeder at distances from 300 to 500 miles. I also have two young Houbens from Laurie Jones that I was going to try. They are from a J&J Payne pair.

We have been blending a long distance Janssen line, based around Phil Trevethan's 2nd Fed Townsville (700 mile) winner in 2005 - known as the 'Townsville Cock' (TC). Introductions of some other well performed birds have also been made or are being trialled. The introductions are presented first below. Our goal was/is to breed a line of birds that has a very high strike rate in the breeding box. Nowadays if you dont clock on the day or in the night you simply don't win so we need a type of bird that can do this without having to be flogged in the training crate. The Janssens have this ability, though few people expect them to be able to fly the long races - but they can and they do!
